Wednesday August 30th

Project Tour - Cowlitz Hydroelectric Project

Two separate tours were offered, one that focused on the various issues and infrastructure associated with project's aquatic implementation and monitoring programs, and the other that focused on the project's terrestrial wildlife and land management programs. Tacoma Power's Jamie Murphy and Chris Foster facilitated the group tour of the Cowlitz Salmon Hatchery and Cowlitz Falls North Shore Collector, while Eric Russell and Cindy Swanberg facilitated the Terrestrial Tour. Many of the programs highlighted were those recently implemented as part of the recent improvements made by Tacoma Power. Participants were allowed to choose which tour they would like to attend.



Cowlitz Salmon Hatchery

Aquatics Tour

The first stop of the Aquatics Tour was at the Cowlitz Salmon Hatchery, one of the largest fish hatcheries in the state. Jamie Murphy provided an overview of Tacoma Power's hatchery program and operations. Eric Shoblom answered questions as to how the hatchery is designed to help meet program goals. Participants where then allowed to tour the facility and observe operations as adults spawned. The next stop was Cowlitz Falls Dam where Chris Foster

discussed the Cowlitz Falls North Shore Collector, some of the unique design features and some of the challenges associated with operating a collector at a facility operated by a neighboring utility. Chris then lead a tour and participants were allowed full access to observe operations.





Terresterial Tour

The Terrestrial Tour was led by Eric Russell and Cindy Swanberg and provided an overview of the roughly 14,200 acre Cowlitz Wildlife Area. The tour started at the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) office in Morton where the Cowlitz Wildlife Area hosted a talk by wildlife scientist Nicholle Stephens on the fisher reintroduction which occurred nearby and the status of elk hoof disease. By then the clouds had lifted and the first tour stop was the top of Dog Mountain, a well-known hang-glider launch offering wide views of Riffe Lake. There Tacoma Power led discussions about the Wildlife Settlement Agreement after nearly 25 years of experience and the challenges posed by the new lower level of Riffe Lake. The group joined the Aquatic Tour in Tacoma's Taidnapam Park for lunch. The remaining time was spent at the

Peterman Hill Unit of the Cowlitz Wildlife Area discussing forest management. Some participants took a short hike on the trail where it is rumored a banana slug was sighted!




